The hospitals in Senegal are in desperate need of financial assistance and resources, supplies and equipment. The most immediate needs are obviously, financial, gloves, IV's, soap, uniforms, hygiene products, oxygen tanks, chest tube chambers, scissors, lotion, IV tubing, refrigerators, OR supplies, sterile products, Saline (NSS, Dextrose, etc), syringes, IV pumps, Foley catheters, band aids, masks, medication and vitamins including pre-natal vitamins, blood pressure cuffs, stethoscopes, hospital beds, wheelchairs, linen for bed, detergent or antiseptic for laundry, up-to-date computers (not exceeding 5 years), administrative equipment including printers, supplies, folders, pens, pencils, and similar. The list is more extensive and the need for quantity (100-1,000's) is imminent.

English School

The English School in Thiès, Sénégal would like to build a new classroom, with more desks and chairs for the children. They are in need of computer and equipment including printer and scanners, school supplies for the children including pens, pencils, notebooks, crayons, rulers, glue and calculators. The classrooms are lacking electricity and air conditioners at this time and as a result it prevents children from attending school during "standard school hours." The school is also in need of an on-site healthcare center and Nurse to care for the children when they are ill and are also in need of a cafeteria. A large majority of the children travel a great distance to school and they are not able to eat at school, they typically go without a meal until the late evening hours or night when they arrive home.

School of the Blind

Institute National d'Education et de Formation de Jeunes Aveugles, INEFJA is located in Thiès, Sénégal. An increasing percentage of children are living at the school because they cannot afford eye glasses or they have cataract as a result of Vitamin A deficiency. The school requests eye glasses for the children, money for scholarships for the children who are able to travel abroad to France and other countries, Clothes for the children that live on site, school supplies including toys and playdoh as well as vitamins and medication. The school is also in need of computers and administrative equipment to help facilitate their learning and the schools growth to reach out to more visually impaired children.
